





- 'I am the princess of Ayodhia'
- Name, Huh Whang Ok
- Age 16
- She married to the local king, Kim Suro
- 10 sons and 2 daughters, becoming the ancestors of Kim Clan
- & Huh clan-The largest population in Korea now
- Huh Whang Ok's tomb is at Kimhae city

Samkuk Yusa, the Chronicles of 3 kingdoms, compiled in 13th Century

The Queen of Boju

 Huh Whang Ok's Posthumous title Is the queen of Boju

Boju is the old name of Anyue in China






